FBI Jacksonville to host first cyber security event at FSU

Jacksonville, Fla. – The FBI Jacksonville Division's Cyber Task Force has partnered with Infragard – Tallahassee and the Florida Technology Council to host a Cyber Security Symposium at Florida State University in March. Special Agents from the FBI Jacksonville Cyber Squad will provide the latest guidance on cyber-related criminal activities including business email compromise, cryptocurrency, skimmers, identity theft, law enforcement cyber careers and more.
